Behold, a virgin shall be with child, and shall bring forth a son, and they shall call his name Emmanuel, which being interpreted is, God with us. Matthew 1:23

- ¹ Now when Jesus was born in Bethlehem of Judaea in the days of Herod the king, behold, there came wise men from the east to Jerusalem,
- ² Saying, Where is he that is born King of the Jews? for we have seen his star in the east, and are come to worship him.
- ³ When Herod the king had heard these things, he was troubled, and all Jerusalem with him.
- ⁴ And when he had gathered all the chief priests and scribes of the people together, he demanded of them where Christ should be born.
- ⁵ And they said unto him, In Bethlehem of Judaea: for thus it is written by the prophet,
- ⁶ And thou Bethlehem, in the land of Juda, art not the least among the princes of Juda: for out of thee shall come a Governor, that shall rule my people Israel.
- ⁷ Then Herod, when he had privily called the wise men, enquired of them diligently what time the star appeared.

- ¹⁰ When they saw the star, they rejoiced with exceeding great joy.
- ¹¹ And when they were come into the house, they saw the young child with Mary his mother, and fell down, and worshipped him: and when they had opened their treasures, they presented unto him gifts; gold, and frankincense, and myrrh.
- ¹² And being warned of God in a dream that they should not return to Herod, they departed into their own country another way.

- ¹³ And when they were departed, behold, the angel of the Lord appeareth to Joseph in a dream, saying, Arise, and take the young child and his mother, and flee into Egypt, and be thou there until I bring thee word: for Herod will seek the young child to destroy him.
- ¹⁴ When he arose, he took the young child and his mother by night, and departed into Egypt:
- ¹⁵ And was there until the death of Herod: that it might be fulfilled which was spoken of the Lord by the prophet, saying, Out of Egypt have I called my son.
- ¹⁶ Then Herod, when he saw that he was mocked of the wise men, was exceeding wroth, and sent forth, and slew all the children that were in Bethlehem, and in all the coasts thereof, from two years old and under, according to the time which he had diligently enquired of the wise men.
- ¹⁷ Then was fulfilled that which was spoken by Jeremy the prophet, saying,
- ¹⁸ In Rama was there a voice heard, lamentation, and weeping, and great mourning, Rachel weeping for her children, and would not be comforted, because they are not.
- ¹⁹ But when Herod was dead, behold, an angel of the Lord appeareth in a dream to Joseph in Egypt,
- ²⁰ Saying, Arise, and take the young child and his mother, and go into the land of Israel: for they are dead which sought the young child's life.
- ²¹ And he arose, and took the young child and his mother, and came into the land of Israel.

- ¹ Then was Jesus led up of the Spirit into the wilderness to be tempted of the devil.
- ² And when he had fasted forty days and forty nights, he was afterward an hungred.
- ³ And when the tempter came to him, he said, If thou be the Son of God, command that these stones be made bread.
- ⁴ But he answered and said, It is written, Man shall not live by bread alone, but by every word that proceedeth out of the mouth of God.
- ⁵ Then the devil taketh him up into the holy city, and setteth him on a pinnacle of the temple,
- ⁶ And saith unto him, If thou be the Son of God, cast thyself down: for it is written, He shall give his angels charge concerning thee: and in their hands they shall bear thee up, lest at any time thou dash thy foot against a stone.

- ¹ And seeing the multitudes, he went up into a mountain: and when he was set, his disciples came unto him:
- ² And he opened his mouth, and taught them, saying,
- ³ Blessed are the poor in spirit: for theirs is the kingdom of heaven.
- ⁴ Blessed are they that mourn: for they shall be comforted.
- ⁵ Blessed are the meek: for they shall inherit the earth.
- ⁶ Blessed are they which do hunger and thirst after righteousness: for they shall be filled.
- ⁷ Blessed are the merciful: for they shall obtain mercy.
- ⁸ Blessed are the pure in heart: for they shall see God.
- ⁹ Blessed are the peacemakers: for they shall be called the children of God.
- ¹⁰ Blessed are they which are persecuted for righteousness' sake: for theirs is the kingdom of heaven.
- ¹¹ Blessed are ye, when men shall revile you, and persecute you, and shall say all manner of evil against you falsely, for my sake.
- ¹² Rejoice, and be exceeding glad: for great is your reward in heaven: for so persecuted they the prophets which were before you.

- ²⁰ For I say unto you, That except your righteousness shall exceed the righteousness of the scribes and Pharisees, ye shall in no case enter into the kingdom of heaven.

- ²² But I say unto you, That whosoever is angry with his brother without a cause shall be in danger of the judgment: and whosoever shall say to his brother, Raca, shall be in danger of the council: but whosoever shall say, Thou fool, shall be in danger of hell fire.
- ²³ Therefore if thou bring thy gift to the altar, and there rememberest that thy brother hath ought against thee;
- ²⁴ Leave there thy gift before the altar, and go thy way; first be reconciled to thy brother, and then come and offer thy gift.
- ²⁵ Agree with thine adversary quickly, whiles thou art in the way with him; lest at any time the adversary deliver thee to the judge, and the judge deliver thee to the officer, and thou be cast into prison.
- ²⁶ Verily I say unto thee, Thou shalt by no means come out thence, till thou hast paid the uttermost farthing.
- ²⁷ Ye have heard that it was said by them of old time, Thou shalt not commit adultery:

- ¹ And when he had called unto him his twelve disciples, he gave them power against unclean spirits, to cast them out, and to heal all manner of sickness and all manner of disease.
- ² Now the names of the twelve apostles are these; The first, Simon, who is called Peter, and Andrew his brother; James the son of Zebedee, and John his brother;
- ³ Philip, and Bartholomew; Thomas, and Matthew the publican; James the son of Alphaeus, and Lebbaeus, whose surname was Thaddaeus;
- ⁴ Simon the Canaanite, and Judas Iscariot, who also betrayed him.
- ⁵ These twelve Jesus sent forth, and commanded them, saying, Go not into the way of the Gentiles, and into any city of the Samaritans enter ye not:
- ⁶ But go rather to the lost sheep of the house of Israel.

- ⁴ How he entered into the house of God, and did eat the shewbread, which was not lawful for him to eat, neither for them which were with him, but only for the priests?
- ⁵ Or have ye not read in the law, how that on the sabbath days the priests in the temple profane the sabbath, and are blameless?

- ²³ And all the people were amazed, and said, Is not this the son of David?
- ²⁴ But when the Pharisees heard it, they said, This fellow doth not cast out devils, but by Beelzebub the prince of the devils.
- ²⁵ And Jesus knew their thoughts, and said unto them, Every kingdom divided against itself is brought to desolation; and every city or house divided against itself shall not stand:
- ²⁶ And if Satan cast out Satan, he is divided against himself; how shall then his kingdom stand?
- ²⁷ And if I by Beelzebub cast out devils, by whom do your children cast them out? therefore they shall be your judges.
- ²⁸ But if I cast out devils by the Spirit of God, then the kingdom of God is come unto you.
- ²⁹ Or else how can one enter into a strong man's house, and spoil his goods, except he first bind the strong man? and then he will spoil his house.
- ³⁰ He that is not with me is against me; and he that gathereth not with me scattereth abroad.
- ³¹ Wherefore I say unto you, All manner of sin and blasphemy shall be forgiven unto men: but the blasphemy against the Holy Ghost shall not be forgiven unto men.

- ⁴⁴ Then he saith, I will return into my house from whence I came out; and when he is come, he findeth it empty, swept, and garnished.
- ⁴⁵ Then goeth he, and taketh with himself seven other spirits more wicked than himself, and they enter in and dwell there: and the last state of that man is worse than the first. Even so shall it be also unto this wicked generation.
- ⁴⁶ While he yet talked to the people, behold, his mother and his brethren stood without, desiring to speak with him.
- ⁴⁷ Then one said unto him, Behold, thy mother and thy brethren stand without, desiring to speak with thee.

- ⁴ And when he sowed, some seeds fell by the way side, and the fowls came and devoured them up:
- ⁵ Some fell upon stony places, where they had not much earth: and forthwith they sprung up, because they had no deepness of earth:
- ⁶ And when the sun was up, they were scorched; and because they had no root, they withered away.
- ⁷ And some fell among thorns; and the thorns sprung up, and choked them:
- ⁸ But other fell into good ground, and brought forth fruit, some an hundredfold, some sixtyfold, some thirtyfold.
- ⁹ Who hath ears to hear, let him hear.
- ¹⁰ And the disciples came, and said unto him, Why speakest thou unto them in parables?
- ¹¹ He answered and said unto them, Because it is given unto you to know the mysteries of the kingdom of heaven, but to them it is not given.
- ¹² For whosoever hath, to him shall be given, and he shall have more abundance: but whosoever hath not, from him shall be taken away even that he hath.
- ¹³ Therefore speak I to them in parables: because they seeing see not; and hearing they hear not, neither do they understand.
- ¹⁴ And in them is fulfilled the prophecy of Esaias, which saith, By hearing ye shall hear, and shall not understand; and seeing ye shall see, and shall not perceive:
- ¹⁵ For this people's heart is waxed gross, and their ears are dull of hearing, and their eyes they have closed; lest at any time they should see with their eyes, and hear with their ears, and should understand with their heart, and should be converted, and I should heal them.
- ¹⁶ But blessed are your eyes, for they see: and your ears, for they hear.
- ¹⁷ For verily I say unto you, That many prophets and righteous men have desired to see those things

- which ye see, and have not seen them; and to hear those things which ye hear, and have not heard them.
- ¹⁸ Hear ye therefore the parable of the sower.
- ¹⁹ When any one heareth the word of the kingdom, and understandeth it not, then cometh the wicked one, and catcheth away that which was sown in his heart. This is he which received seed by the way side
- ²⁰ But he that received the seed into stony places, the same is he that heareth the word, and anon with joy receiveth it;
- ²¹ Yet hath he not root in himself, but dureth for a while: for when tribulation or persecution ariseth because of the word, by and by he is offended.
- ²² He also that received seed among the thorns is he that heareth the word; and the care of this world, and the deceitfulness of riches, choke the word, and he becometh unfruitful.
- ²³ But he that received seed into the good ground is he that heareth the word, and understandeth it; which also beareth fruit, and bringeth forth, some an hundredfold, some sixty, some thirty.
- ²⁴ Another parable put he forth unto them, saying, The kingdom of heaven is likened unto a man which sowed good seed in his field:
- ²⁵ But while men slept, his enemy came and sowed tares among the wheat, and went his way.
- ²⁶ But when the blade was sprung up, and brought forth fruit, then appeared the tares also.
- ²⁷ So the servants of the householder came and said unto him, Sir, didst not thou sow good seed in thy field? from whence then hath it tares?
- ²⁸ He said unto them, An enemy hath done this. The servants said unto him, Wilt thou then that we go and gather them up?
- ²⁹ But he said, Nay; lest while ye gather up the tares, ye root up also the wheat with them.³⁰ Let both grow together until the harvest: and in
- the time of harvest I will say to the reapers, Gather ye together first the tares, and bind them in bundles to burn them: but gather the wheat into my barn.
- ³¹ Another parable put he forth unto them, saying, The kingdom of heaven is like to a grain of

mustard seed, which a man took, and sowed in his field:

- ³² Which indeed is the least of all seeds: but when it is grown, it is the greatest among herbs, and becometh a tree, so that the birds of the air come and lodge in the branches thereof.
- ³³ Another parable spake he unto them; The kingdom of heaven is like unto leaven, which a woman took, and hid in three measures of meal, till the whole was leavened.
- ³⁴ All these things spake Jesus unto the multitude in parables; and without a parable spake he not unto them:
- ³⁵ That it might be fulfilled which was spoken by the prophet, saying, I will open my mouth in parables; I will utter things which have been kept secret from the foundation of the world.
- ³⁶ Then Jesus sent the multitude away, and went into the house: and his disciples came unto him, saying, Declare unto us the parable of the tares of the field.
- ³⁷ He answered and said unto them, He that soweth the good seed is the Son of man;
- ³⁸ The field is the world; the good seed are the children of the kingdom; but the tares are the children of the wicked one;
- ³⁹ The enemy that sowed them is the devil; the harvest is the end of the world; and the reapers are the angels.
- ⁴⁰ As therefore the tares are gathered and burned in the fire; so shall it be in the end of this world.
- ⁴¹ The Son of man shall send forth his angels, and they shall gather out of his kingdom all things that offend, and them which do iniquity;
- ⁴² And shall cast them into a furnace of fire: there shall be wailing and gnashing of teeth.
- ⁴³ Then shall the righteous shine forth as the sun in the kingdom of their Father. Who hath ears to hear, let him hear.
- ⁴⁴ Again, the kingdom of heaven is like unto treasure hid in a field; the which when a man hath

- found, he hideth, and for joy thereof goeth and selleth all that he hath, and buyeth that field.
- ⁴⁵ Again, the kingdom of heaven is like unto a merchant man, seeking goodly pearls:
- ⁴⁶ Who, when he had found one pearl of great price, went and sold all that he had, and bought it.
- ⁴⁷ Again, the kingdom of heaven is like unto a net, that was cast into the sea, and gathered of every kind:
- ⁴⁸ Which, when it was full, they drew to shore, and sat down, and gathered the good into vessels, but cast the bad away.
- ⁴⁹ So shall it be at the end of the world: the angels shall come forth, and sever the wicked from among the just,
- ⁵⁰ And shall cast them into the furnace of fire: there shall be wailing and gnashing of teeth.
- ⁵¹ Jesus saith unto them, Have ye understood all these things? They say unto him, Yea, Lord.
- ⁵² Then said he unto them, Therefore every scribe which is instructed unto the kingdom of heaven is like unto a man that is an householder, which bringeth forth out of his treasure things new and old.
- ⁵³ And it came to pass, that when Jesus had finished these parables, he departed thence.
- ⁵⁴ And when he was come into his own country, he taught them in their synagogue, insomuch that they were astonished, and said, Whence hath this man this wisdom, and these mighty works?

- ¹ For the kingdom of heaven is like unto a man *that is* an householder, which went out early in the morning to hire labourers into his vineyard.
- ² And when he had agreed with the labourers for a penny a day, he sent them into his vineyard.
- ³ And he went out about the third hour, and saw others standing idle in the marketplace,
- ⁴ And said unto them; Go ye also into the vineyard, and whatsoever is right I will give you. And they went their way.
- ⁵ Again he went out about the sixth and ninth hour, and did likewise.
- ⁶ And about the eleventh hour he went out, and found others standing idle, and saith unto them, Why stand ye here all the day idle?
- ⁷ They say unto him, Because no man hath hired us. He saith unto them, Go ye also into the vineyard; and whatsoever is right, *that* shall ye receive.
- ⁸ So when even was come, the lord of the vineyard saith unto his steward, Call the labourers, and give them *their* hire, beginning from the last unto the first.

- ³⁵ That upon you may come all the righteous blood shed upon the earth, from the blood of righteous Abel unto the blood of Zacharias son of Barachias, whom ye slew between the temple and the altar.

- ¹⁰ When Jesus understood it, he said unto them, Why trouble ye the woman? for she hath wrought a good work upon me.
- ¹¹ For ye have the poor always with you; but me ye have not always.
- ¹² For in that she hath poured this ointment on my body, she did it for my burial.
- ¹³ Verily I say unto you, Wheresoever this gospel shall be preached in the whole world, there shall also this, that this woman hath done, be told for a memorial of her.
- ¹⁴ Then one of the twelve, called Judas Iscariot, went unto the chief priests,
- ¹⁵ And said unto them, What will ye give me, and I will deliver him unto you? And they covenanted with him for thirty pieces of silver.
- ¹⁶ And from that time he sought opportunity to betray him.
- ¹⁷ Now the first day of the feast of unleavened bread the disciples came to Jesus, saying unto him, Where wilt thou that we prepare for thee to eat the passover?
- ¹⁸ And he said, Go into the city to such a man, and say unto him, The Master saith, My time is at hand;

- I will keep the passover at thy house with my disciples.
- ¹⁹ And the disciples did as Jesus had appointed them; and they made ready the passover.
- ²⁰ Now when the even was come, he sat down with the twelve.
- ²¹ And as they did eat, he said, Verily I say unto you, that one of you shall betray me.
- ²² And they were exceeding sorrowful, and began every one of them to say unto him, Lord, is it I?
- ²³ And he answered and said, He that dippeth his hand with me in the dish, the same shall betray me.
- ²⁴ The Son of man goeth as it is written of him: but woe unto that man by whom the Son of man is betrayed! it had been good for that man if he had not been born.
- ²⁵ Then Judas, which betrayed him, answered and said, Master, is it I? He said unto him, Thou hast said.
- ²⁶ And as they were eating, Jesus took bread, and blessed it, and brake it, and gave it to the disciples, and said, Take, eat; this is my body.
- ²⁷ And he took the cup, and gave thanks, and gave it to them, saying, Drink ye all of it;
- ²⁸ For this is my blood of the new testament, which is shed for many for the remission of sins.
- ²⁹ But I say unto you, I will not drink henceforth of this fruit of the vine, until that day when I drink it new with you in my Father's kingdom.
- ³⁰ And when they had sung an hymn, they went out into the mount of Olives.
- ³¹ Then saith Jesus unto them, All ye shall be offended because of me this night: for it is written, I will smite the shepherd, and the sheep of the flock shall be scattered abroad.
- ³² But after I am risen again, I will go before you into Galilee.
- ³³ Peter answered and said unto him, Though all men shall be offended because of thee, yet will I never be offended.
- ³⁴ Jesus said unto him, Verily I say unto thee, That this night, before the cock crow, thou shalt deny me thrice.
- ³⁵ Peter said unto him, Though I should die with thee, yet will I not deny thee. Likewise also said all the disciples.

- ³⁶ Then cometh Jesus with them unto a place called Gethsemane, and saith unto the disciples, Sit ye here, while I go and pray yonder.
- ³⁷ And he took with him Peter and the two sons of Zebedee, and began to be sorrowful and very heavy.
- ³⁸ Then saith he unto them, My soul is exceeding sorrowful, even unto death: tarry ye here, and watch with me.
- ³⁹ And he went a little further, and fell on his face, and prayed, saying, O my Father, if it be possible, let this cup pass from me: nevertheless not as I will, but as thou wilt.
- ⁴⁰ And he cometh unto the disciples, and findeth them asleep, and saith unto Peter, What, could ye not watch with me one hour?
- ⁴¹ Watch and pray, that ye enter not into temptation: the spirit indeed is willing, but the flesh is weak.
- ⁴² He went away again the second time, and prayed, saying, O my Father, if this cup may not pass away from me, except I drink it, thy will be done.
- ⁴³ And he came and found them asleep again: for their eyes were heavy.
- ⁴⁴ And he left them, and went away again, and prayed the third time, saying the same words.
- ⁴⁵ Then cometh he to his disciples, and saith unto them, Sleep on now, and take your rest: behold, the hour is at hand, and the Son of man is betrayed into the hands of sinners.
- ⁴⁶ Rise, let us be going: behold, he is at hand that doth betray me.
- ⁴⁷ And while he yet spake, lo, Judas, one of the twelve, came, and with him a great multitude with swords and staves, from the chief priests and elders of the people.
- ⁴⁸ Now he that betrayed him gave them a sign, saying, Whomsoever I shall kiss, that same is he: hold him fast.
- ⁴⁹ And forthwith he came to Jesus, and said, Hail, master; and kissed him.
- ⁵⁰ And Jesus said unto him, Friend, wherefore art thou come? Then came they, and laid hands on Jesus, and took him.
- ⁵¹ And, behold, one of them which were with Jesus stretched out his hand, and drew his sword, and

- struck a servant of the high priest's, and smote off his ear.
- ⁵² Then said Jesus unto him, Put up again thy sword into his place: for all they that take the sword shall perish with the sword.
- ⁵³ Thinkest thou that I cannot now pray to my Father, and he shall presently give me more than twelve legions of angels?
- ⁵⁴ But how then shall the scriptures be fulfilled, that thus it must be?
- ⁵⁵ In that same hour said Jesus to the multitudes, Are ye come out as against a thief with swords and staves for to take me? I sat daily with you teaching in the temple, and ye laid no hold on me.
- ⁵⁶ But all this was done, that the scriptures of the prophets might be fulfilled. Then all the disciples forsook him, and fled.
- ⁵⁷ And they that had laid hold on Jesus led him away to Caiaphas the high priest, where the scribes and the elders were assembled.
- ⁵⁸ But Peter followed him afar off unto the high priest's palace, and went in, and sat with the servants, to see the end.
- ⁵⁹ Now the chief priests, and elders, and all the council, sought false witness against Jesus, to put him to death;
- ⁶⁰ But found none: yea, though many false witnesses came, yet found they none. At the last came two false witnesses,
- ⁶¹ And said, This fellow said, I am able to destroy the temple of God, and to build it in three days.
- ⁶² And the high priest arose, and said unto him, Answerest thou nothing? what is it which these witness against thee?
- ⁶³ But Jesus held his peace. And the high priest answered and said unto him, I adjure thee by the living God, that thou tell us whether thou be the Christ, the Son of God.
- ⁶⁴ Jesus saith unto him, Thou hast said: nevertheless I say unto you, Hereafter shall ye see the Son of man sitting on the right hand of power, and coming in the clouds of heaven.
- ⁶⁵ Then the high priest rent his clothes, saying, He hath spoken blasphemy; what further need have we of witnesses? behold, now ye have heard his blasphemy.
- ⁶⁶ What think ye? They answered and said, He is guilty of death.

- ⁶⁷ Then did they spit in his face, and buffeted him; and others smote him with the palms of their hands,
- ⁶⁸ Saying, Prophesy unto us, thou Christ, Who is he that smote thee?
- ⁶⁹ Now Peter sat without in the palace: and a damsel came unto him, saying, Thou also wast with Jesus of Galilee.
- ⁷⁰ But he denied before them all, saying, I know not what thou sayest.
- ⁷¹ And when he was gone out into the porch, another maid saw him, and said unto them that were there, This fellow was also with Jesus of Nazareth.

- ⁷² And again he denied with an oath, I do not know the man.
- ⁷³ And after a while came unto him they that stood by, and said to Peter, Surely thou also art one of them; for thy speech bewrayeth thee.
- 74 Then began he to curse and to swear, saying, I know not the man. And immediately the cock crew.
- ⁷⁵ And Peter remembered the word of Jesus, which said unto him, Before the cock crow, thou shalt deny me thrice. And he went out, and wept bitterly.

THE GOSPEL ACCORDING TO MATTHEW CHAPTER 27

- ¹ When the morning was come, all the chief priests and elders of the people took counsel against Jesus to put him to death:
- ² And when they had bound him, they led him away, and delivered him to Pontius Pilate the governor.
- ³ Then Judas, which had betrayed him, when he saw that he was condemned, repented himself, and brought again the thirty pieces of silver to the chief priests and elders,
- ⁴ Saying, I have sinned in that I have betrayed the innocent blood. And they said, What is that to us? see thou to that.
- ⁵ And he cast down the pieces of silver in the temple, and departed, and went and hanged himself.
- ⁶ And the chief priests took the silver pieces, and said, It is not lawful for to put them into the treasury, because it is the price of blood.
- ⁷ And they took counsel, and bought with them the potter's field, to bury strangers in.
- ⁸ Wherefore that field was called, The field of blood, unto this day.
- ⁹ Then was fulfilled that which was spoken by Jeremy the prophet, saying, And they took the thirty pieces of silver, the price of him that was valued, whom they of the children of Israel did value;
- ¹⁰ And gave them for the potter's field, as the Lord appointed me.
- ¹¹ And Jesus stood before the governor: and the governor asked him, saying, Art thou the King of the Jews? And Jesus said unto him, Thou sayest.
- ¹² And when he was accused of the chief priests and elders, he answered nothing.
- ¹³ Then said Pilate unto him, Hearest thou not how many things they witness against thee?
- ¹⁴ And he answered him to never a word; insomuch that the governor marvelled greatly.
- ¹⁵ Now at that feast the governor was wont to release unto the people a prisoner, whom they would.
- ¹⁶ And they had then a notable prisoner, called Barabbas.
- ¹⁷ Therefore when they were gathered together, Pilate said unto them, Whom will ye that I release

- unto you? Barabbas, or Jesus which is called Christ?
- ¹⁸ For he knew that for envy they had delivered him.
- ¹⁹ When he was set down on the judgment seat, his wife sent unto him, saying, Have thou nothing to do with that just man: for I have suffered many things this day in a dream because of him.
- ²⁰ But the chief priests and elders persuaded the multitude that they should ask Barabbas, and destroy Jesus.
- ²¹ The governor answered and said unto them, Whether of the twain will ye that I release unto you? They said, Barabbas.
- ²² Pilate saith unto them, What shall I do then with Jesus which is called Christ? They all say unto him, Let him be crucified.
- ²³ And the governor said, Why, what evil hath he done? But they cried out the more, saying, Let him be crucified.
- ²⁴ When Pilate saw that he could prevail nothing, but that rather a tumult was made, he took water, and washed his hands before the multitude, saying, I am innocent of the blood of this just person: see ye to it.
- ²⁵ Then answered all the people, and said, His blood be on us, and on our children.
- ²⁶ Then released he Barabbas unto them: and when he had scourged Jesus, he delivered him to be crucified.
- ²⁷ Then the soldiers of the governor took Jesus into the common hall, and gathered unto him the whole band of soldiers.
- ²⁸ And they stripped him, and put on him a scarlet robe.
- ²⁹ And when they had platted a crown of thorns, they put it upon his head, and a reed in his right hand: and they bowed the knee before him, and mocked him, saying, Hail, King of the Jews!
- ³⁰ And they spit upon him, and took the reed, and smote him on the head.
- ³¹ And after that they had mocked him, they took the robe off from him, and put his own raiment on him, and led him away to crucify him.

- ³² And as they came out, they found a man of Cyrene, Simon by name: him they compelled to bear his cross.
- ³³ And when they were come unto a place called Golgotha, that is to say, a place of a skull,
- ³⁴ They gave him vinegar to drink mingled with gall: and when he had tasted thereof, he would not drink.
- ³⁵ And they crucified him, and parted his garments, casting lots: that it might be fulfilled which was spoken by the prophet, They parted my garments among them, and upon my vesture did they cast lots.
- ³⁶ And sitting down they watched him there;
- ³⁷ And set up over his head his accusation written, THIS IS JESUS THE KING OF THE JEWS.
- ³⁸ Then were there two thieves crucified with him, one on the right hand, and another on the left.
- ³⁹ And they that passed by reviled him, wagging their heads,
- ⁴⁰ And saying, Thou that destroyest the temple, and buildest it in three days, save thyself. If thou be the Son of God, come down from the cross.
- ⁴¹ Likewise also the chief priests mocking him, with the scribes and elders, said,
- ⁴² He saved others; himself he cannot save. If he be the King of Israel, let him now come down from the cross, and we will believe him.
- ⁴³ He trusted in God; let him deliver him now, if he will have him: for he said, I am the Son of God.
- ⁴⁴ The thieves also, which were crucified with him, cast the same in his teeth.
- ⁴⁵ Now from the sixth hour there was darkness over all the land unto the ninth hour.
- ⁴⁶ And about the ninth hour Jesus cried with a loud voice, saying, Eli, Eli, lama sabachthani? that is to say, My God, my God, why hast thou forsaken me? ⁴⁷ Some of them that stood there, when they heard
- that, said, This man calleth for Elias.

 48 And straightway one of them ran, and
- ⁴⁸ And straightway one of them ran, and took a spunge, and filled it with vinegar, and put it on a reed, and gave him to drink.
- ⁴⁹ The rest said, Let be, let us see whether Elias will come to save him.
- ⁵⁰ Jesus, when he had cried again with a loud voice, yielded up the ghost.

- ⁵¹ And, behold, the veil of the temple was rent in twain from the top to the bottom; and the earth did quake, and the rocks rent;
- ⁵² And the graves were opened; and many bodies of the saints which slept arose,
- ⁵³ And came out of the graves after his resurrection, and went into the holy city, and appeared unto many.
- ⁵⁴ Now when the centurion, and they that were with him, watching Jesus, saw the earthquake, and those things that were done, they feared greatly, saying, Truly this was the Son of God.
- ⁵⁵ And many women were there beholding afar off, which followed Jesus from Galilee, ministering unto him:
- ⁵⁶ Among which was Mary Magdalene, and Mary the mother of James and Joses, and the mother of Zebedee's children.
- ⁵⁷ When the even was come, there came a rich man of Arimathaea, named Joseph, who also himself was Jesus' disciple:
- ⁵⁸ He went to Pilate, and begged the body of Jesus. Then Pilate commanded the body to be delivered.
- ⁵⁹ And when Joseph had taken the body, he wrapped it in a clean linen cloth,
- ⁶⁰ And laid it in his own new tomb, which he had hewn out in the rock: and he rolled a great stone to the door of the sepulchre, and departed.
- ⁶¹ And there was Mary Magdalene, and the other Mary, sitting over against the sepulchre.
- ⁶² Now the next day, that followed the day of the preparation, the chief priests and Pharisees came together unto Pilate,
- ⁶³ Saying, Sir, we remember that that deceiver said, while he was yet alive, After three days I will rise again.
- ⁶⁴ Command therefore that the sepulchre be made sure until the third day, lest his disciples come by night, and steal him away, and say unto the people, He is risen from the dead: so the last error shall be worse than the first.
- ⁶⁵ Pilate said unto them, Ye have a watch: go your way, make it as sure as ye can.
- ⁶⁶ So they went, and made the sepulchre sure, sealing the stone, and setting a watch.
